1. Call to Order

8. Reports

a. Staff - Mr. Stuckey

- a. Foods 30 is baking up a storm with European bread products and now desserts in Creative Baking. Next Gingerbread is structures.
- b. Foods 20 has finished cooking poultry, fish and seafood and are now learning to bake bread. They can't wait for the cinnamon buns that will be made next week.
- c. Foods 10 are working on creative cold foods and then onto meat cookery.
- d. We are collecting items for the Kinsmen Christmas Hampers from November 28 until December 9th. We are hoping to collect new toys, gift cards and monetary donations for less fortunate families in the Parkland and Stony Plain area. Boxes will be placed in block one classes and in the main office.

- e. November 27-December 11 is our online book fair at sparkbookfairs.ca. Thousands of discounted titles for all ages are on there and 20% of proceeds comes back to the school. There is free shipping on orders over \$45 and items are shipped directly to the buyer.
- f. On October 27, the Marketing class traveled to several businesses to learn how businesses use visual merchandising, displays, and marketing in general. On October 28, Shelly Britton from the CBC visited to explain how the CBC uses marketing to generate revenue and how ratings affect revenue. Then on November 23, MCHS alumni, Lexie Bouilly, spoke to the class. She owns and operates her own Social Media company called Sixth Sense Marketing.
- g. In Legal Studies, the students begin preparing for their mock trial that will be held at the U of A on Friday, December 2 in the Moot Courtroom. All week, students take on the role of a character in a homicide trial and prepare. On December 8, they will also travel to the Edmonton Law Courts to watch court and see how law is practiced in a trial.
- h. On October 20, Colin Christensen from NXT GEN, who is a serial entrepreneur, came and spoke to the Entrepreneurship class about innovation and startups. On October 25, Adam MacArthur from Community Futures Capital Region came and spoke to the class about the YETI program where students are given seed capital to start a real business during the summer. It is a great opportunity as the money does not have to be paid back! Then on November 8, James Cookson visited the class. He is self taught on how to code, develop software and build apps. He has since sold his app to many other companies for use. On December 6, the Entrepreneur class will be traveling to various local businesses in the area.
- In Accounting, the students had guest speakers from the CPA on November 2. It was very informative for students who may be interested in a career in Accounting.
- j. On Wednesdays during Torch Time, the Business Competition Club meets. They are learning the Case Method. They are traveling to MacEwan on Saturday December 3 to compete against other schools in the MacEwan Business Challenge for \$500 in cash. Students who are competing at this event include Ryan Burton, Ryder Reaney, Jaleesa Anderson, and Hunter Hollands on Team 1. b. Principal Report - Ms. Jensen

a. Diploma Results - Last June was the first typical exam session since COVID. <u>MCHS had excellent results</u>. The results are used by teachers to do a gap analysis on the top 5 questions we performed well on and the 5 questions that we did the weakest on compared to the province.

- b. MCHS Public Outbreak Prior to Fall Break, our absenteeism rate was greater than 10% which required us to report our numbers to Alberta Health Services and is considered outbreak status. The outbreak status ended during Fall Break and on the first day back our absenteeism rate was 2.6%
- c. Class Sizes Numbers were reviewed in October. The maximum number of students is 34 per class.
