Project focus:

• supporting equitable opportunities for Indigenous students in Alberta's provincial schools to enroll in post-secondary education

Project goal:

• collaborate with Indigenous community, government, and post-secondary education research members to identify and redress academic streaming practices that may disproportionately limit Indigenous students' access to post-secondary education

Project objectives:

- identify academic streaming practices that may disproportionately limit Indigenous students' access to post-secondary education
- identify solutions to eliminate and prevent these streaming practices
- implement identified strategies in several Alberta schools
- assess their effectiveness

Research design:

• interviews and focus groups being conducted with Indigenous students, their parents/caregivers, and educators/administrators in publicly funded/provincial schools across Alberta
