### 6. Presentation - Off Campus Ed by Kathy Klemp

- **a. Work Experience** Students can earn one credit for every 25 hours of work. They can try different occupations. It can lead to the RAP program. The student is required to do the HCS3000 module which is now part of CALM as a virtual module.
- b. **Green Certificate** This is an apprenticeship style, workforce development program. Students are required to do AGR3000. Students can earn 16 30 level credits. Students learn more about agriculture and can be recognized for what they already do. They work with a trainer and go through a manual. Testing happens 3 times per year.
- c. **CAREERS** This program is to encourage youth to move into trades and other employment sectors. It is a paid internship program. It movivates students by making the workplace an extension of the classroom. There are initiatives to attract more women and indigenous students.
