1. Call to Order

- a. The meeting was called to order at 7:04 pm.

2. Approval of Agenda

6. Presentation - Off-site Programs Presentation (Kathy Klemp and Troy Stuckey)

- a. **Career Internship 10** - Students will be assisted in finding places that will allow them to try different work positions. Students can try a few different types of jobs to earn 3 - 5 credits. This is typically a non-paid position.
- b. **Work Experience** - Most students already have a job when signing up for this program. They can earn up to 15 credits by working 25 hours for one credit.
- c. **Green Certificate Program** - This is an agricultural program where students work in an agricultural setting. There are 11 different types of specializations. Students work with a manual under the supervision of a trainer. Testing is oral.
- d. **CAREERS** - This is a not-for-profit organization that acts as an intermediate between students and the trades. The main goal is to encourage students to join the trades. They are paid internships that are predominantly done during the summer. The six areas are trades, agriculture, information technology, energy, forestry, and health.
- e. **Registered Apprenticeship Program** - A maximum of 40 credits can be earned for a total of 1000 hours of work. Students get paid to work and also participate in learning. You must do research into which trade you would be interested in. It is recommended that students enroll in the grade 10 and 11 CTS courses first before entering this program.
- f. **Dual Credit Program** - This is an opportunity to do post-secondary courses during high school at no cost. Examples of courses happening this year are Sociology, anatomy, and physiology.

- g. **Building Futures** - Students work on an actual building site to build a home. Students get to experience the different types of trades necessary to build a house. They also work on their core subjects. The program for grade 10 students is a full time program where students can earn up to 60 credits. For grade 11 and 12 students, the program is half a day and the student can earn 10 credits.

7. New Business

- a. **Grade 10 Open House** - Feb 13, 5:30 - 8:00 - A table for School Council will be set up. Laurie Haak and Jen Geddes will work at the table. A QR code will be set up to get contact information. A discussion took place about how to better communicate to families about upcoming School Council meetings.

- c. A suggestion was made to modify the agenda format to move the Next Meeting Dates to before the Adjournment.
