1. Call to Order

- a. The meeting was called to order at 7:02 pm.

2. Land Acknowledgement

6. Old Business (Ms. Haak)

- a. Alberta School Councils' Association - Korina Parent has offered to attend the Spring Symposium (April 26) and Annual General Meeting (April 27) on behalf of MCHS.
- b. Staff Appreciation - Wording for the Torch Newsletter was provided by Sarah Corker. It will be posted on social media. A list of dietary restrictions will be brought to the next meeting and Mr. Haley will confirm if the Foods class can help with preparations.

7. New Business (Ms. Haak)

- a. Anonymous Donation - It was agreed that the donation would go towards the staff appreciation.
- b. Torch Time - A parent brought forward their concern that reducing the number of Torch Times next year from four to one would negatively impact their students academically and mentally. Corey stated that since only approximately 20% of students utilize Torch Time that a change was necessary. The school is looking at other methods of support for the students who use Torch Time such as teachers providing time in class for doing assignments and providing help sessions during lunch hours.

a. Staff – Ms. Cox

- a. Course selections - grade level teams are visiting classes this week (pink and blue planning sheets). Online will open up after spring break (April 8-17)- a video tutorial will be posted, as well as a link to the request form if needed.
- b. Taylor Tompkins won first place at the District level for Black & White Poster in the Senior category in the Legion's Remembrance Day contest. Andrew Benkovich was here March 10 to present Taylor with a certificate and a cheque. Taylor's poster will move on to compete at the next level.
- c. The most recent Anime Movie Night was on March 14. It was a fun night with lots of games and Anime! The next Anime Movie Night is going to be on April 25, 2025 from 4:00 pm until 9:00 pm in room 1065.
- d. Our Anime Convention, Memfest, is happening on May 10 from 11:00 am to 4:00 pm. More information to come but we will have participants, performers, and vendors from current and past students. This is truly a Memorial project from start to finish with all vendors and participants being either present or past students. Posters and information pamphlets will be sent out to Parkland schools as this is an invite-only event. This is a fun and safe environment where everyone gets to experience a mini anime convention. Break out the cosplay, watch some performances, and play some games!
- e. German 20 & 30 will be having a field trip to Old Strathcona in May, where they will enjoy a traditional German dinner and some sightseeing of some German landmarks in the neighborhood.

- g. MCHS E-Sports had our first Alberta-based online tournament this weekend (March 22-23), a big milestone for our new team.
- h. Robotics completed their first Season of our new robotics league - FIRST Tech Challenge. The team was almost entirely newcomers so it was a building year, but they competed in 4 tournaments and built a lot of skills.
- i. Choir:
 1. The choir sang at the Good Samaritan Care Centre on March 5. It was incredibly joyful, the residents loved it, and it was heartwarming to see the students interacting with the seniors!
 2. The choir sang three songs at PSD's Choral Celebration on March 17. It's a highlight of the choir year to perform and inspire the younger singers in our division. Our Vocal Ensemble represented MCHS beautifully, and we even received fan mail from total strangers who greatly appreciated our performance.
 3. The Vocal Ensemble also performed on March 21 at a sold-out community choir event at Horizon Stage, impressing everyone with their pop stylings.
 4. A group of MCHS singers sang the national anthem at The Battle of the Badges hockey game on March 22 in Spruce Grove. Again, I'm proud to report the students represented our school most respectfully and professionally at this event.
 5. The choir performs next in the St. Albert Rotary Music Festival on April 8, performing four competition pieces; French, Latin, an African-American spiritual piece, and a contemporary setting will all be showcased.


